I've been working at IFPB for almost eight years and I can tell you I've never been more excited about our opportunities to continue sending innovative delegations to Israel/Palestine and strengthening movements for justice in North America. Here's why I'm so hopeful:

- Interest in IFPB delegations grows every year. ***More and more people want to hear and spread the message of Israeli and Palestinian peace advocates.***
- Our groundbreaking advocacy work prepares delegates to leverage the delegation experience to educate others. We've just added post-delegation ***skills-building webinars that make it easier for delegates to connect with movement leaders and get the tools they need*** to work for change.
- Our dedicated, hard-working Board of Directors met in February and refined a series of plans to secure our future. ***Keep reading for details on an exciting initiative to build more regional connections among IFPB delegates and take our work to the next stage.***
- Khader Adnan and several other Palestinian administrative detainees have stirred the conscience of the world. You already know there is active nonviolent resistance going on every day, but these hunger strikers are powerful reminders of the need to redouble our efforts. ***The time is ripe to share their stories here while building movements for justice in Israel/Palestine.***

Here's why IFPB could really use ***your renewed help*** for the future.

We've grown tremendously in the past few years. When I started in 2004, 120 people had participated in an IFPB delegation; now almost 700 delegates have made the journey!

To respond to the new opportunities of having so many delegates doing so much good work, we've come up with a creative plan to foster **IFPB regional networks**. Our plan envisions more delegate-to-delegate contact, more opportunities for delegates and allies to work directly with IFPB and, ultimately, more intentional commitment to furthering the advocacy work that delegations catalyze.

Delegate experience and skills will be shared more broadly. Our staff and board will help sustain those important person-to-person contacts that build enthusiasm, multiply strength, and foster lifetime commitment. Delegate networks around the country will recruit potential delegates, help support them on return, and help us identify resources to make it all possible. Most importantly, delegates will learn from each other, sharing the experiences, skills, and organizing strategies that will enrich our collective work toward the goal of a just peace in Israel/Palestine.

These steps toward a re-imagined and more connected community take time, hard work and financial resources. Building this network requires even more personal contact with former delegates and better online organizing tools. We know this is an essential investment in broadening IFPB's base so that, together, we can increase our contributions to the movement for justice and peace in Israel/Palestine.
